First Reading

Acts 2:1-21

A reading from Acts: ¹When the day of Pentecost had come, [the apostles] were all together in one place. ²And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. ³Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. ⁴All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

⁵Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. ⁶And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. ⁷Amazed and astonished, they asked, “Are not all these who are speaking Galileans?” ⁸And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? ⁹Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, ¹⁰Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, ¹¹Cretans and Arabs—in our own languages we hear them speaking about God’s deeds of power.” ¹²All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, “What does this mean?” ¹³But others sneered and said, “They are filled with new wine.”

Office Project

In last week's congregational meeting you all received an updated quote for a possible project that Council has been considering. With the addition of the camera system and the use of the pastor's office for multiple functions during the week the current office is not ideal for member privacy and document storage. There are three portions of this project that were quoted all together. We will be getting a broken-down quote in front of you so you can see the component parts. It should be noted that not all of these projects would need to be done at this time.

New office portion:

- Installing a new door on the current coat room.
- Moving a light switch and changing one outlet.
- Prepping the room for paint, we paint.
- We remove the coat racks and relocate them to the gallery space.

Gallery space:

- Create a wing wall to be in compliance with ADA requirements. This would be a small portion of wall that would extend out and prevent visually impaired individuals from walking into the newly moved coat racks.
- They would prep the space for paint, and we would paint it.

Old Office portion:

- Creating a large closet capable of holding folding tables and chairs for functions held in the Narthex.
- Moving some duct work and lights.
- Installing new lights.
- There will be one outlet added to the camera operating area.
